B. INTRODUCTION:

In order to prevent oral disease the client must be aware of and participate in preventive oral health care interventions. The student will learn to educate the client on how to use these interventions according to individual needs, in order that client compliance or adherence is maintained. This course will deal with the hygienist as an educator/facilitator and prepare the student to work with clients in order to help them maintain their oral health.

Following Prevention 1, the student is able to explain the application of preventive measures and methods in relation to oral health. In this course, this skill will be incorporated into the ability to educate oral hygiene measures in relation to dental health status, as well as the following competences will be further developed:

00LE - Be able to communicate in a professional manner with the client and the work team.

00LF - Establish connections between nutrition and oral health.

00LG-Elaborate a preventive treatment plan.

00LH- Inform the client of the possible treatments.

00LJ - Educate the client about preventive measures in relation to dental health.

00LQ - Intervene in the area of preventive dental health.

This course incorporates evidence-based practice: an approach where clinical expertise is blended with the highest quality research while taking into account the client's needs and preferences. The students will use evidence-based practice in all aspects of the course.

A detailed profile of the course outcome is summarized in section C: Course Objectives.

The **Comprehensive Assessment (CA)** requires graduating students to demonstrate the integration of acquired competencies within the Dental Hygiene program. In order to graduate, the student is required to successfully complete the fifteen elements of the CA during the fifth and the sixth semester.
